Between the Ears: Behavior and Compliance

Safety professionals can face significant challenges sometimes while striving to protect employees' hearing. Complex noise environments, variable activities, the constraints of the job, communication needs, as well as other safety equipment can impact our efforts to provide effective hearing loss prevention. But sometimes it seems like the biggest hurdle can be the employees themselves.

This workshop will discuss some of the psychological factors that can cause people to neglect their long-term hearing health. What elements of human nature affect our decisions, and how we can use this information to shape employee priorities and behaviors?

Laura Kauth graduated from the University of Iowa with undergraduate degrees in English, biology, and psychology, and later earned a Master's in audiology. After ten years of combined clinical and occupational practice, she decided to devote her attention entirely to



hearing conservation. Currently she contracts independently, teaches CAOHC courses through the University of Iowa and the Iowa-Illinois Safety Council, and serves the National Hearing Conservation Association as President-Elect. In her free time she engages in guerilla audiology, accosting random strangers with hearing protection and education.

Jo-Anna has been with the Workplace Safety and Health Division for over 25 years and has held many different positions within the Division, including a number of years working as a field Safety and Health Officer. She has held the position of Director, Prevention Services Branch for the last 10 years. Jo-Anna is a graduate of the Occupational Safety and Health Certificate Program from the University of Manitoba Continuing Education Department as well as a Canadian Registered Safety Professional (CRSP).

Darren Doryniak, Acting Vice President, HR, Administration, and IT, WCB of Manitoba. Working at the WCB of Manitoba for the past 27 years Darren has extensive experience in the Workers Compensation field.
